


SUMMER







TASTY JERKEY

Rhea Jackson

Cut thin strips of beef or venison (about 1X3-inches) making sure all fat is removed. Marinate 24 hours in the following sauce:

- 1 c. soy sauce
- 1 c. Worcestershire sauce
- ½ c. salad oil
- 1 t. garlic salt
- 1 t. onion salt
- 1 t. accent
- 1 t. savor salt
- 1 t. pepper

Dry in electric dehydrator or hang on string in basement until dried. (Protect floor from drips by using old towels or rugs underneath line.)

YENISON JERKEY

Donna J. Rowe

3 lbs. venison scraps, cut thin 1/3 c. Worcestershire sauce

⅓ c. soy sauce

- 1 t. salt
- 1 t. chili powder
- 1 t. onion powder
- l t. garlic salt
- 1 to 2 t. pepper

Stir all ingredients well; add meat, making sure it is coated well. Soak overnight. Lay meat strips on broiler pan and bake approximately 6 hours at 150° to 200°.


JERKEY

Third Ward R.S. Bulletin

3 lbs. meat, cut in thin strips

- 1 T. salt
- 1 t. powdered onion
- 1 t. powdered garlic
- 1 to 2 t. pepper, to taste
- 1/3 c. Worcestershire sauce
- 4 c. soy sauce

Make sure all strips of meat are covered in the above mixture. Let stand 8 hours or overnight. Drain on paper toweling. Bake in 125° to 140° oven, leaving oven door slightly ajar so meat will dry out. This takes 6 to 8 hours depending on the thickness of the meat. If desired you can "hang" meat over rungs of oven shelf; put foil in oven bottom to catch drippings. Wrap rung with a small piece of foil.




