PARLIAMENTARY PROCEDURE - A parliamentary procedure system by which we will run all Executive Meetings henceforth was established at last month's meeting. This does not involve too much, but will ensure that everyone will be heard, Chapter Chiefs or their authorized representative, and in an orderly and organized fashion. An item of the greatest importance is that only one person, who is properly recognized by the Lodge Chief, be speaking at a time. Advisors are asked to refrain from interrupting the normal course of the Executive Meeting by refraining their remarks to their individual Chapter Chief, or else can be heard during the Advisors session during the Committee break. We hope that all will comply with the new system.

CHAPTER CHIEFS AND AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVES - Last month at the LECM it was approved unanimously that only the Chapter Chief, Vice Chief, Secretary, or Treasurer, may officially represent a Chapter at the Lodge Meeting and have the right of a vote. If all four of these elected officers are absent, then that Chapter loses its right of representation and vote.

LODGE COMMITTEE REPORTS - We would like for each Lodge Committee Chairman to turn in a written report of his meeting to the Editor directly after the committee meetings. If the report will be of general interest to the Lodge as a whole, we will print it in the Echo.

LODGE NECKERCHIEF SLIDES - The Lodge is purchasing a supply of Ordeal, Brotherhood, and Vigil Honor neckerchief slides which will feature the Lodge number in gold imprinted on them. They are available to all Lodge members of the appropriate rank. You will be able to purchase one of these great treasures for the first time at the Spring Fellowship. The cost of the slides are as follows: Ordeal - 75ϕ ; Brotherhood - 85ϕ ; Vigil - \$1.00. Be sure to get yours as soon as you can.

LODGE BEAD SYSTEM - At last month's Lodge Executive Meeting it was approved to start a bead system for Arrowmen to wear beads appropriate to individual recognition earned for Chapter and Lodge accomplishments. Only a brief outline was presented at that time, but at the March LECM a detailed explanation will be given and asked for approval. SMOKE SIGNALS FROM THE CHIEF

This year our new Lodge administration established a new program in controlling the organization of the Lodge and Chapters. The system has been experimented within past years on an extremely small scale, however, those times when it was exercised it was proved invaluable. So this year the program is being practiced on a full scale basis. Some controversial static has been brought to my attention merely through misunderstanding of the overall program. So I have written this article to alleviate all misunderstandings of the present policies relating to program and to open the door to further discussion, if need be, by merely contacting myself by phone at 278-0191.

Basically the program consists of a committee organization system in which the Lodge and, <u>likewise</u> the Chapters, (for it is only obvious that the Lodge could not operate proposed system with any measure of success unless the Chapters follow suit) operate together in the promotion of Scout Camping and Service in Brotherhood. One of the major objectives of the program is to immunize Arrowmen in duly elected positions from the well known disease "DO-IT-ALL ONESELFITIS", which has plagued elected officials for decades. With a committee organization many Arrowmen can have the opportunity to become active in the place of elected officials doing a half-fast solo on important routine jobs.

In closing may I just coin the well-known phrase: "He alone is worthy to wear the Arrow who will continue faithfully to serve his fellow man". Let us at least put this responsibility upon the Arrowmen of this Lodge by giving them the opportunity to serve.

ORGANIZE, DEPUTIZE, AND SUPERVISE

Organize, Deputize, and Supervise - These are the key three words of success which go into the recipe that produces LEADERSHIP, slogan is a direct quotation from a very famous and well respected professional Scouter now in Hawaii, John W. Ingham, Commander, United States Navy, Retired, with whom I have had the privilege of working. First, a potential leader must ORGANIZE his policies in a fashion he deems appropriate for success. Secondly, he must DE-PUTIZE to those in whom he has full confidence various assignments, goals, and proper authority for carrying out the mission of the administration. Thirdly, he must SUPERVISE those who he has deputized to ensure that they do in fact accomplish their tasks. One cannot merely supervise oneself. ALL three parts of the triangle are essential, for if any one part of the recipe is missing, there is no Leadership; if there is no leadership, there is no Service; if there is no service, there are no Accomplishments; if there are no accomplishments, then there can be no EL-KU-TA Lodge and the Order of the Arrow.

In the future, let's have every elected and appointed officer and chairman of the Lodge or Chapter strive to make the recipe complete. As your Lodge Chief stated on page 7 in his article, "lets immunize ourselves from the disease 'DO-IT-ALL ONESELFITIS'".
