

LEADERSHIP – LEARN IT RIGHT!

Do you want to be a Chief or a Vice Chief for you chapter, the Lodge or the Section?

If your goals in the Order of the Arrow is to be a Chief or a Vice Chief then you need to register for Takachsin. Takachsin is a leadership course designed for the specific challenges that comes with managing large groups of people.

At Takachsin you will learn the skills you need to be an effective leader to take our Lodge or your Chapter to the next level. All the skills you learn while enrolled in Takachsin are hands on leadership skills. On the last 3 days of the course we encourage your advisor to come up to the course and give you a job so that you can immediately use the skills you have learned and make a difference in the way your Chapter is run.

No course in this council gives you as much "hands on training" in the skills you need to be one of this lodges most effective leaders. In addition to the 11 must know leadership skills you will learn you will also see some of this councils most impressive ceremonies including the calling of the 11 chiefs and the original ordeal ceremony performed by the best ceremony team in the lodge. You will also learn how to build you own Native American outfits for your ceremony teams and how to perform Native American dances during our Pow Wow. Native American Dancing and Outfitting will be taught by some of the best Outfitters and Dancers in our Lodge.

This years Takachsin course will be held at Camp Travis from July 9th to July 14th. Cost is \$125 dollars if you have your registration and fees in before June 1st. The price will increase to \$145 dollars if you register after June 1st so hurry and take advantage of this \$20 dollar discount. All you need for the course is your uniforms and a sleeping bag, we provide food, Utensils, tents, course materials, and a T-shirt. Slots are limited for this course to 60 participants. Participants are selected on a first come first serve bases.

For over 20 years the El-Ku-Ta Lodge has maintained one of the best youth leadership programs in the nation. Takaschin (Leader) is held each year for 64 selected Arrowmen at the Travis Training Center, East Fork of the Bear.

Since the course is limited, it is important to schedule this as soon as you decide on your summer commitments. The cost is \$125.00, the course runs from Monday through Saturday

morning and is an in-depth leadership training course.

In the OA, all events are organized and carried out with youth leadership. Often those events involve several hundred people and last for several days. We train leadership to handle those activities as well as teaching some of the values that are core to the Scouting experience.
