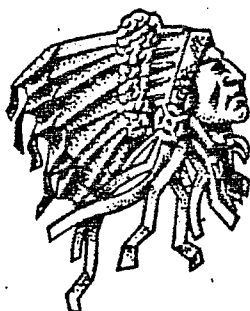

ELANGOMAT REEMPHASIS

BECAUSE THE POSITION OF THE ELANGOMAT IS SO IMPORTANT TO THE FURTHERING OF THE ORDER IN THE LIVES OF THE NEWLY INTRODUCED MEMBERS AND BECAUSE THE ELANGOMAT IS BY DEFINITION A FRIEND TO THE CANDIDATES IN THEIR STRUGGLE OF THE ORDEAL, A NEW EMPHASIS CAN AND WILL BE PUT ON THIS POSITION AND CRUCIAL PART OF THE ENTIRE PROGRAM OF THE ORDER.

FIRST, THE INDIVIDUALS THAT WILL SERVE AS ELANGOMATS WILL BE CHOSEN BY THE ELANGOMAT CHIEF WITH THE MAJOR INPUT OF THE CHAPTER CHIEFS.

SECOND, THE ARROWMEN WHO TAKE PART AND SERVE AS ELANGOMATS WILL BE MEMBERS OF THE "ELANGOMAT" CLAN.

THIS ELANGOMAT CLAN WILL IN TURN HAVE SPECIAL FUNCTIONS FOR ITS MEMBERS AS A CLAN OF BROTHERS OF SERVICE.

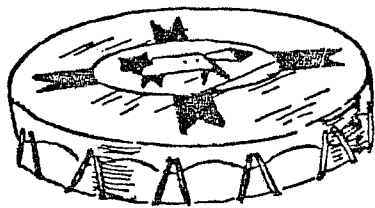

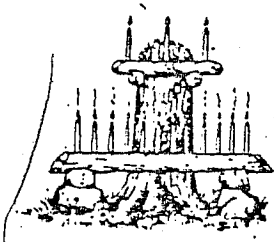

Andy Sorenson is a member of the Dabyowk chapter and has been actively involved in that chapter.

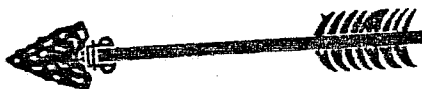
Secretary

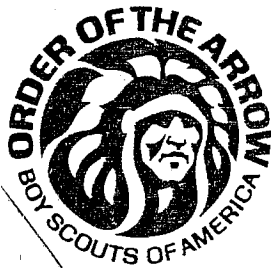
