# N.L.S. - WANT TO GO?

On October 13-15, 2006 the Western Region Chief will host a National Leadership Seminar at Tracy. Known as the NLS this seminar involves a training group composed of national and section leaders. It is the premier leadership training course on the national level.

If you have gone to it once, you are not eligible to attend a  $2^{nd}$  time.

The program starts on Friday night about 7:00 p.m. and ends on Sunday around noon. The cost is approximately \$110.00 per participant. If your are interested in going email the lodge chief and let him know.
