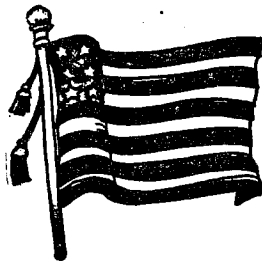
# COUNCIL OF THE CHIEFS
