



To help you handle your elections, Election-Man had me write up a quick list of guidelines for unit elections. Here they are...

- Elections can be held for Scout, Varsity, and Explorer units.
- 50% of the active male membership must be present at the time of the election.
- A young man must have 15 days and nights of camping, including one long term camp.
- First Class rank is required for membership,
- To be elected, a boy needs to appear on 50% of the ballots. On the ballots, you can vote for up to one-half of the number of eligible boys.
- Voters should cast their vote for those that they think have set the best examples of brotherhood, cheerfulness, and service.
- Boys already members of the order are not counted as eligible.
- Also, remember the purpose of the order. One of the major purposes is to recognize the honor campers in each unit. Even though the thought may sadden you, the Order of the Arrow just may not be for everyone. You will find some young men who are just not mature enough for this honor.
- *+* So, get out there and do your elections. Don't miss any unit, because the Order of the Arrow could make a difference in some young man's life that will only get the chance to be a member if YOU go and hold an election for him, *+*
