OCTOBER SERVICE -

Due to the price increases by National Supply (for example about \$1.00 on a sash) the Ordeal fee has been increased.

For 2003 the Ordeal fee will be \$45.00. It includes the sash, ribbon pin, handbook, pocket flap, food, dues, insurance and promotional costs. We hope that you all understand that it is driven by National Supply and not the Lodge.

BROTHERHOOD COST -

The new Brotherhood cost after February 1, 2003, will be \$15.00 for the new sash. Sash prices have resulted in this increase also.
