A yearly calendar is an important promotion tool.




Out growth is just beginning to show promise. New activities in the chapters are being reported with an increasing frequency and success.

Darren will be in charge of the O.A. Service Corps to be formed for service at the Scout show.




As a Vice Chief for the past several years, he has been responsible for a number of programs leading to the present success of the Lodge.





In addition it is a time for a new member to review his personal commitment to the Scout Oath and Law and his personal code of Honor.


For this reason and others it is important the the ordeal be conducted in strict accordance to the guidelines established in the Handbook. Silence is one of those important guidelines.

For a candidate to break silence is a reason to further review his commitment to his personal honor with him so that the importance of the Ordeal is established.

For a member to encourage the breaking of silence is an indication of the members lack of personal commitment. This member has joined the Order for the wrong reasons.

As we participate in staff assignments at Ordeals and other Ceremonies, remember the obligation that we bear and act accordingly.

Ordeals are serious matters.
