



The official insignia of the Order of the Arrow are some of the most colorful in Scouting. It is the responsibility of all Arrowmen to wear them proudly and correctly.

All sashes are worn with the arrow pointing over the right shoulder. They may not be altered in any way, and no other badges are to be worn on them, with the exception of the 50th Anniversary Award and the 60th Anniversary Bicentennial Award. The Arrow sash is worn at Order of the Arrow functions and at special Scout functions such as courts of honor. It is not to be worn at troop meetings. This is to be done only when members need to be identified for rendering special services. The sash is not to be folded and hung from the belt.



The Lodge Summer Fellowship was truly the outstanding social event of the year.


Those of you who were not there missed some fantastic Indian Costuming displays. Our brothers who presented themselves for costume judging here have done a superb job.





LODGE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING

The best way to provide opportunities for all Arrowmen to participate in the Lodge and its programs is for Chapter Officers to follow some simple guidelines:

- 1. Discuss Lodge programs with your advisor BEFORE the meeting and come prepared to participate.
- 2. Bring a list of your supply needs: Arrow Pins, Lodge flaps, 6" diameter Lodge patch, O.A. sashes, Lodge Service Slide, Order of the Arrow handbooks, Unit Election Forms, Lodge Service Slide scorreboards, etc.
- 3. Have all Chapter Officers in attendance with all Chapter Advisors each month to get Lodge information to take back to your Chapter and to give the Lodge your Chapter information on Lodge programming.
- 4. Sign up for service and participation opportunities as early as possible to allow good promotion with the Chapter.
- 5. Get the Chapter business done-such as Unit Election Forms and money making forms, etc. turned in--as soon as possible so that the Chapter remains healthy.
- 6. Keep accurate Chapter records.
- 7. Turn in Chapter news for the ECHO.



Dear Arrowmen,

I would like to thank all of the people who have helped with the Summer Fellowship, and those who have helped with Ordeals throughout the year.

So far this year the Lodge has given over 8000 man hours of service to the community and the council. The service projects that have been completed come from a wide range of things. Some of the projects completed are; the painting of the buildings and the fixing up of the Water Front at Camp Tracy Wigwam, helping with City and County flood control (sandbagging and mud clean up), service at various Camporees, Arrow of Light ceremonies for Cub Scouts, and promoting "No Trace" camping in the Scout Units.

The Lodge would like to have the Chapters elect new officers by the end of August for two reasons, the first is so that the new officers can start planning the year, the second is so that the new officers can be trained at the Lodge Training Conference to be held on September 10th.

There are several things that I would like to see the Lodge accomplish this year. The first is a higher percentage of Ordeal Members obtaining Brotherhood, and the second is I would like to see the Chapters push the "No Trace" program to the Units in their Districts. One way to present this program without a lot of extra work is to show the filmstrip and hand out the books when you are holding a unit election with



a unit. In addition to electing the boys, giving the "No Trace" camping presentation will give the troop a glimpse of what the Order of the Arrow does, and it will give the troop some valuable camping instruction. Please remember to wear a complete Scout Uniform when representing the Lodge or Chapter. First impressions are important!


