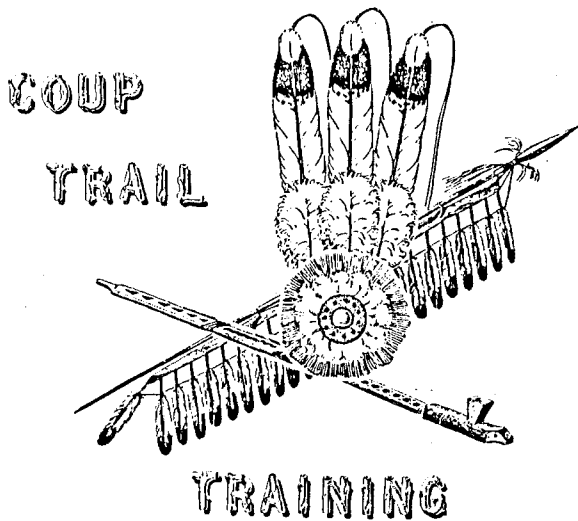

INDIAN SPRINGS (3)

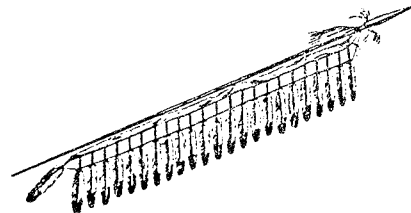

BARTON JEFFS Lodge Dance Chief. Barton has great experience in

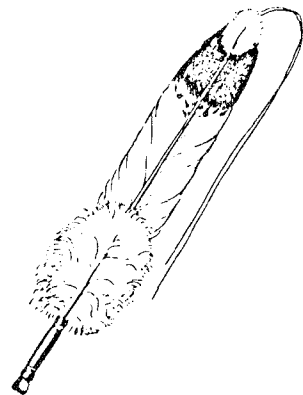
dance and with chapter administration. He is from Leke Nimat.

If he is not suggest that he put \$4.00 into an envelope with his name and address and send it in to the office.

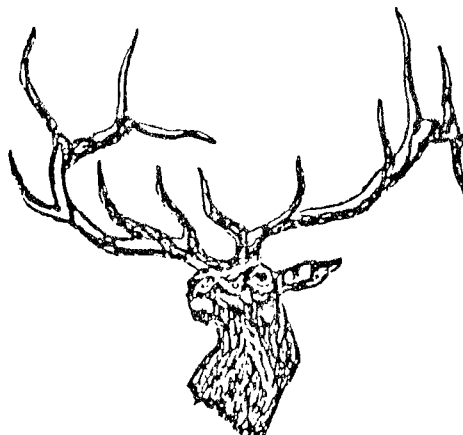
A renewal of you membership does a number of things:

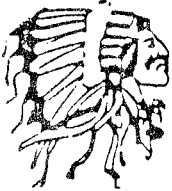
