BROTHERHOOD NEWS


Kyle Condie, reports that 2 members went through the Brotherhood at the Fellowship.

Thanks to *Brian Henry*, we have one of the best lodge web pages in the country. Here is how you get to it. The address is www.gslc-bsa.org. When you get there click on the Order of the Arrow and you have the menu. Here is what you can find:

The front page has been redesigned to provide immediate links to the online registration, the calendar and other things.

- 1. Ways to contact all of the chapters, lodge officers and lodge advisers.
 - 2. Coming events and the details on them.
- 3. Information about using the online registration so that you don't have to run up to the service center or rely on the mail.
- 4. Details about our ordeals, brotherhoods, training courses, fellowship etc. including photos of some of them.
- 5. Links to the Section page, the Region OA page and the National OA Page.
- 6. Photos of some of the lodge leadership so you can recognize them.
 - 7. Forms and Manuals.
 - 8. Service opportunities that you can sign up for.

REGISTRATION

Yes, it is past time for registration. Check your mailing label. If the date on it is 2007 (if we have your email address we'll notify you online) or earlier, it is time to register. With the current year, if you are receiving this Legend, you can go to the web page and register on it. Registration give you —

1. Issues of the Legend after this one.

- 2. An opportunity to fund the lodge and its programs we don't get money from the council and are proud of the chance we have to finance our own program.
- 3. Since we are self sustaining, it is important that we support our own program.
- 4. Don't let your membership hang by a thread register for the coming year now.

Since only a limited number have been issued, you are advised to purchase what you want early. When they are gone, they are gone. No re-orders, at least on the night time patch.

LODGE POLICY

Often youth or adults want the council or lodge to approve staff applications for OA assignments at Jamborees, Section Conclaves, National Conferences or other area, regional or national events.

It is the policy of the lodge that in order to be approved, a member must be currently registered with the council **and** the lodge.

If you submit an application that needs approval and are not registered, it will be returned with a request that you register and then re-submit it.

TAKASCHIN THANKS

Takaschin was established 20 years ago. The lodge saw a need for a new type of leadership course. The course was founded to provide leadership training in situations where large events were being planned, groups with specific skills needed to be formed, and were leaders had to deal with a wide range of ages.

The course is available to 64 Arrowmen each year.

Since that time the course has trained several Lodge Chiefs, 2 Region Chiefs, a National Chief and leadership for many chapters, section offices and lodge committees.

ARROWCORPS⁵ is the 2008 National Service Project. Five National Forests have been selected in which 1000 arrowmen each will be providing service with a view of making a serious impact on the forest.

The sites are: Manti-LaSal Forest, Mt. Shasta Forest, Washington-Jeffferson Forest, Mark Twain Forest and the Bridger-Teton Forest. Participants will spend a week working in the forest at various projects and have one of the days off to enjoy the recreational opportunities in the area.

The Manti LaSal project will be cutting out invasive growths at Buckhorn Wash close to Price, Utah. Unfortunately, the project starts on the last day of our fellowship for next year, so it would be hard to make this one and the fellowship also.

More information as well as registration information can be obtained from the national web page dedicated to the projects. Follow our links to the national page and then their links to the ARROWCORP⁵ site. There are some age and physical condition requirements that must be met if you are interested. Adults and youth can sign up for the projects.

Signups are individual and some have very unique twists to them. The project in the Mt Shasta region will operate on GPS headings rather than trails. This may be of special interest to many of you.

As always you must be registered with the lodge and with the council to sign up for any of these projects.
