



#### **TAKASCHIN**

Over twenty years ago, the Lodge wrote and produced a new kind of training course for youth leaders. Originally known as Coup Trail, the course has been, for the past sever years name Takaschin - Leader.

It is based on assumption that most leadership exists where the leader has to not only direct the group he leads, but in most cases form the group to accomplish the task.

Since it's foundation, it has provided the basis of leadership for numerous lodge and section officers, 2 Regions Chiefs and a National Chief of the OA. It builds on Silver Moccasin and other national training course, but is unique in that it's principles approximate real life situations where groups and teams are formed to complete specific goals.

The 2011 Course is already forming. We are looking for staff (must have prior Takaschin experience or national experience) and for participants.

The course will only take 48 candidates and in the past has filled fast. The costs for the week will be about \$135.00 which includes all of the food, equipment, insurance, and training materials. Final cost will be announced in September.

If you want to participate in a mountain top experience, Takaschin is the place to do it.
