Area Conference

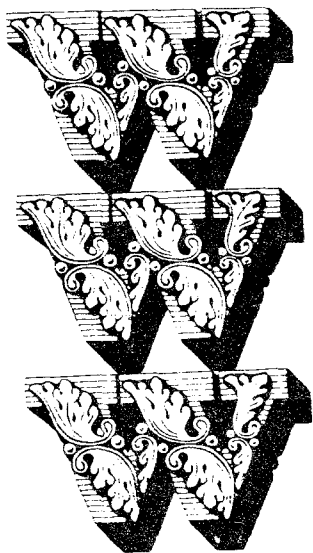
