





Special thanks to Mike McBride and his staff for a great time. More about the event will appear in the next issue.


Thanks to Jim McBride for his efforts and Wayne Jacobsen for handling the behind scenes efforts and to Paul Smith for the rifles.

It is probably a good time to start planning for the fall pow-wow that is just around the corner in October.





LOOKS LIKE THAT STEAK WILL BE JUST RIGHT AT THE SUMMER FELLOWSHIP.


The Lodge is expanding! Growth is great but it causes us real problems. We need the some strong committees in the lodge.

Growth During the Year


