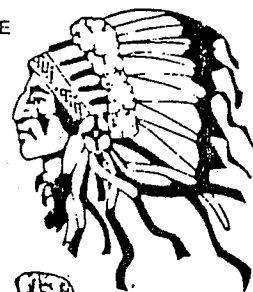

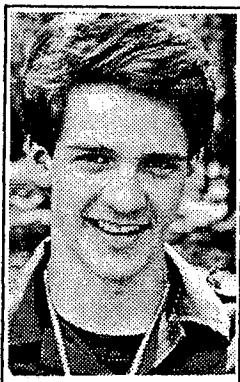

This past year has been a great success and I know that I speak for Brad when I say thanks to all those who helped make it so successful.

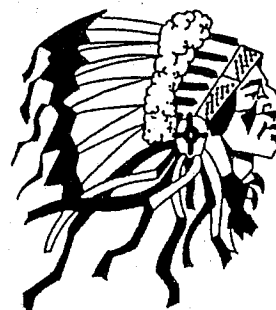

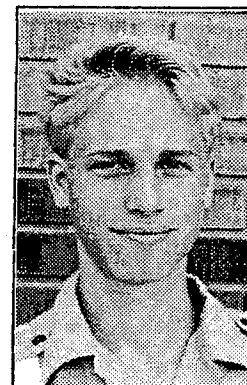
His hobbies are hiking, camping, singing in Madrigals, and most of all having fun.

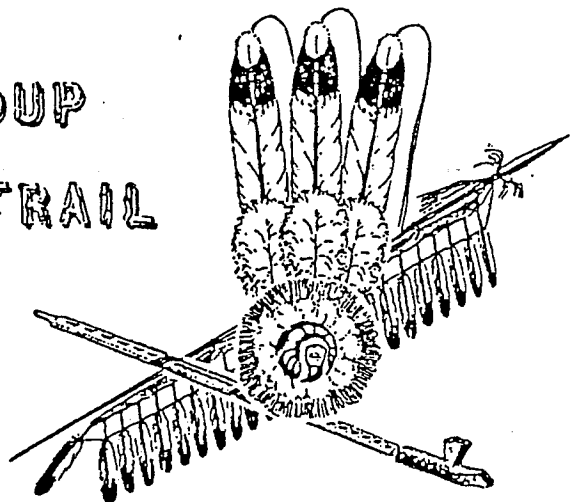

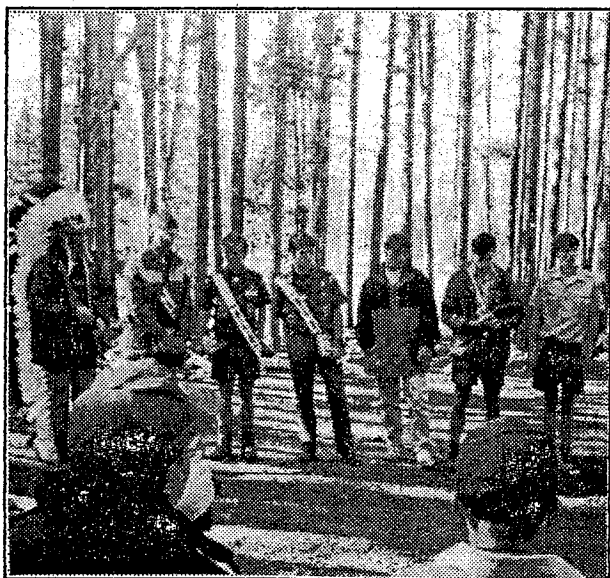
## LETTER FROM THE COUP TRAIL CHIEF

All the 82 arrowmen that attended agree it was a fantastic year.

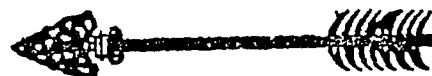

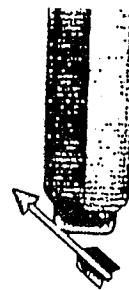
### CETAN:

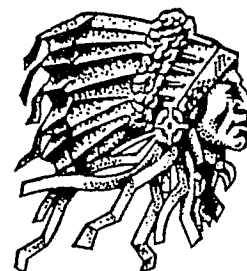

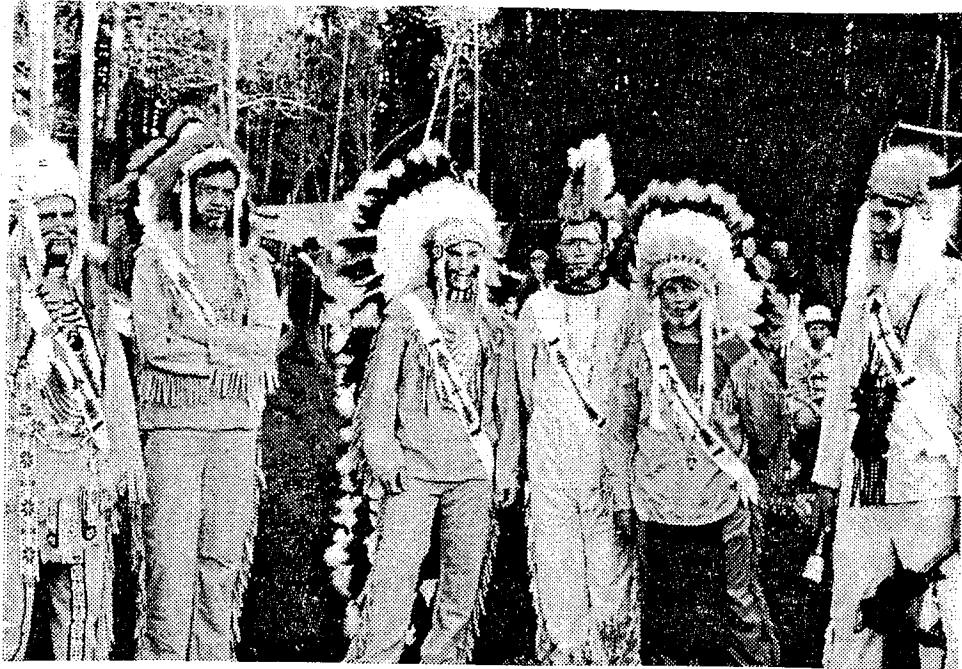
