This summer we hope to see the wiring and plumbing roughed in and the main supports and bracing of the floor and second story repaired.


With the coming of fall it will be time to do some drywall work and building of interior walls.

Get organised and join us.





ORDEAL

The May Ordeal at Tracy was a tremendous success. Over 1200 service hours of work on the Tracy camp and with the Forest service were completed.

About 120 new ordeal members were inducted at four ceremonies which were held at the two new eremony grounds the lodge built during the last year.

The Trading post was completely overhauled with new wiring and drywall, trails were improved, the O.A. lookout was finished, the Nature Lodge was painted on the outside and and a number of repairs made, and the Pool area was cleaned. There were a number of other projects that were completed in Cub Country.


The Lodge is Proud to Welcome SCOTT NIXON as the New Advisor of Farmington Bay Chapter.


