3½ YARDS OF 36" MATERIALS IS ENOUGH FOR SIZES UP TO 16 OR 17

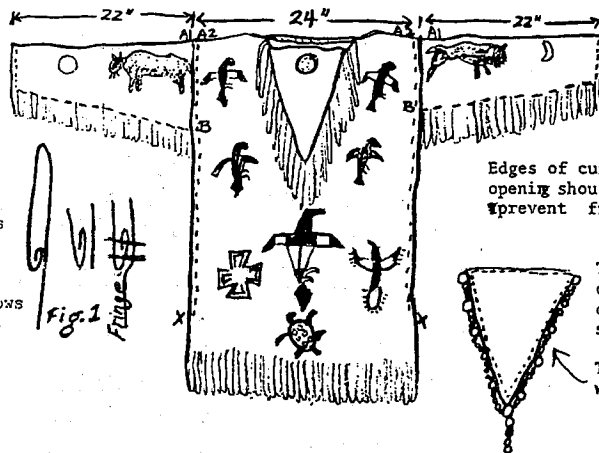
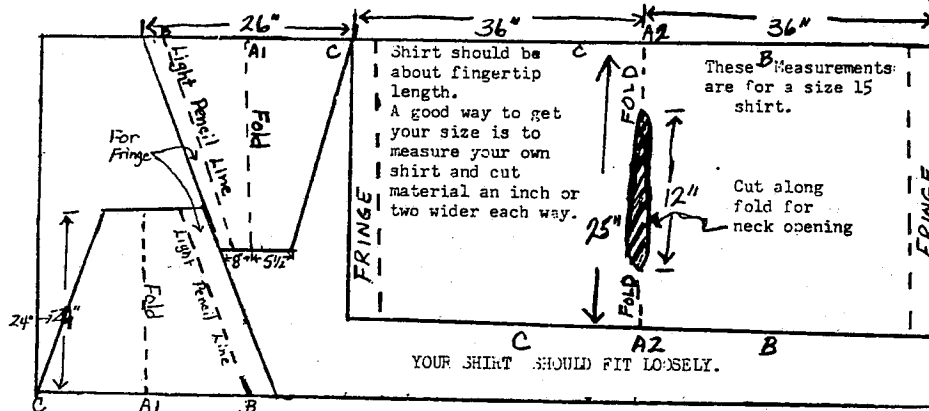
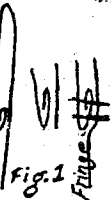


Fig. 1 shows how to sew bottom seam of sleeve, using two rows of stitches.



Sew shirt sleeve B to C.. Match sleeve head A1 to shirt head A2, and sew. Then sew shirt B to C. Cut fringe ½" wide with scissors, cutting with the weave and not at an angle. DO NOT CUT FRINGE ON SHIRT BOTTOM OR SLEEVES UNTIL SHIRT IS COMPLETELY MADE.
