
#### PICTOGRAPHIC PORTRAYAL OF THE O.A. LEGEND

A pictographic portrayal of the events of the Order of the Arrow Legend in poetic form will be included as a special insert of the Echo in the next three editions. Part 1, included with this edition, has the pictures of the legend and the first page of the explanations related to each drawing. Note that the story starts in the center of the picture and follows in a counter-clockwise continuous circular motion. This legend can be painted onto a large hide and ideally utilized during an Ordeal ceremony as a prop or visual aid. As Meteu is reciting the legend, he can point to each of the appropriate figures. It also serves as a great
