


## ZCMI CENTER DISPLAY


The Scout Display at the ZCMI Center was a great success, with all of the color and enthusiasm and glamor of each booth display area. It was held on February 4, 1984.



The many displays were exquisitely enhanced by the presence of our proud teepee










There was a display showing the Great Salt Lake Council Camps, and what each one has to offer.







Boy Scout Troop 25 showed different camping equipment and knots.




Patch displays and trading are always fun. But wouldn't you know it, you could not get Dave Halliday's nose out of the TELESCOUT.




### COLE SLAW
