

to offer.







BRIGHTON CHAPTER is changing its name to the MACHQUE CHAPTER (which means Bear in the Lenni Lenelope language).


They assisted at the Klondike Derby in January in the Park City Area and is looking forward in assisting in the Spring Camporee.




Good for 8 hungry Boy Scouts.

1½ cups mayonnaise


1½ tbsp sugar
