The 1990 year closed out with the lodge again increasing in size. We ended the year with 1502 members up from 1259 a year ago. Once again we retained our honor lodge designation thanks to the efforts of the brotherhood committee under the direction of Jase Feichko.

734 new Ordeal members joined the lodge, 130 members completed their Brotherhood requirements and 20 new Vigil members were inducted. # Camping Yuba Lake



Promotion of camping in the council is a prime purpose of the Order of the Arrow. Each issue, a new camping site will be presented which has been recommended by a lodge member. We will need your help on this, so if you know of a good campsite, (with pictures, if possible) PLEASE, send it in to The Legend c/o the council with your name and home phone number.

Yuba Lake is a great place to camp in the early to middle part of the summer. Because it does take a couple of hours to reach Yuba Lake, it may not be suitable for overnight campouts.

Travel south on Interstate 15 to the Levan exit (at the south end of Nephi). Go south to Levan and turn left at the main intersection in town. Go about fifteen or so miles to the Painted Rock State Park turnoff. About a quarter mile in on this road, turn right. Now you are heading north, paralleling the lake shore. Follow this road about a mile until you get to a road which follows a wash down to the lake. These roads are usually passable.


The beach makes a good campsite. Wood is usually available. Fires should be kept away from vegetation. Potable water and toilet facilities are not available. The area is well suited for a long term



camp, but in late summer, it can be quite hot and large, violent thunderstorms often sweep across the lake in the afternoon.

The campsite has a good beach for waterfront activities. Canoeing, rowing, sailing, fishing, and swimming are all good bets. Because of its isolation, the area is also ideal for wilderness survival, archery, rifle and shotgun, and wide games. The lake is a half mile across at this point so that a mile swim can be accomplished by swimming across and back. (It may be a little shorter if the water is down)

Wildlife in the area includes deer, rabbits, kangaroo rats, and lizards. As in any area where desert meets water, you should be very careful of snakes. Rattlesnakes have been found in the area.
