All in all, the lodge banquet was a great place to be and if you were not there you missed out on all the fun and excitement that you could pack into one night.

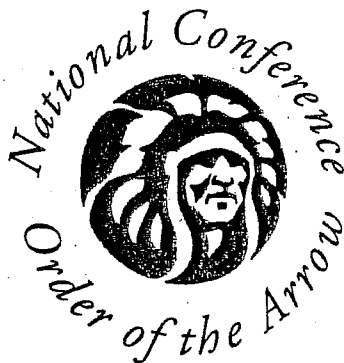
SCOUT-O-RAMA

A Note from the Advisor

YOUR MEMBERSHIP DUES

The dues that each of use pay support the basic
program of the lodge, publish the newsletter, pay our
annual registration to national, provide money for printing
and postage, provide training materials for chapters such
as videos etc., and support the work of the lodge.

Dues have been \$5.00 since 1983 without change.
Costs have risen each year. In fact, it really costs about
\$10.00 a year per arrowman to sustain the activity of our
lodge. The balance comes from the sales of the trading post
(mostly flaps). Chapter Chiefs are discussing an increase to
help the lodge meet its obligations.

Our fiscal year starts on July 1 and ends the
following June 30. The lodge rules provide that dues are to
be paid at the start of the fiscal year.

Chapter Officers and Lodge Officers agree that the
collection of dues from our members should take place in
late spring and summer as our lodge rules require. This
will free up for chapters to concentrate on their members in
the fall. thanks to each of you who supported the fall drive.
We'll try and do it on time this year.
