

# Smoke Signals From-the Chief





This year there will be a change in Lodge Officer election procedure. The Lodge Officer elections will be held at the Summer Fellowship, at the East Fork of the Bear River Scout Camp, June 16, 17 and 18, 1983. To be a candidate for a lodge office you must first submit your name, the office you are running for, and a brief biography about yourself (what you have done in scouting), to the lodge executive committee no later than Thursday, June 9, 1983. This information will then be printed in the Echo. If you do not announce your candidacy by the 9th of June deadline, you will not be able to be a candidate in this year's Lodge Officer elections.

The lodge offices that you may run for are: Lodge Chief; Vice Chief Activities; Vice Chief Service; Vice Chief Chapters; Lodge Secretary; Lodge Treasurer. A brief description of each office is as follows: Lodge Chief -oversees all Lodge activities, functions, records, finances, and all other Lodge programs. Vice Chief Activities -- dance team, Ceremonies, high adventure, camping promotion, where to go camping book. Chief Service -- Ordeals, Brotherhood, elangomat, Tracy OA Lodge. Vice Chief Chapters--LECM. chapter-lodge relations, chapter of the year award, general questions. Lodge Secretary-registration, mailing, publications, records. Lodge Treasurer -- trading post, supplies, books, finance, special orders, properties.

We hope to see everyone at the Summer Fellowship.



#### TUMMY TICKLERS

This is a great main dish for hungry boys. Serves 8

#### BEEF CHOW MEIN

- 1-1/2 pounds stew meat (cut up steak)
- 2 medium size onions
- 1 small bunch celery
- 1 small cabbage (about 1-1/2 pounds)
- 1-1/3 cups rice (about 12 oz)
  - 1 small bottle soy sauce
  - 1 tbsp. shortening

Put 5 quarts water on to boil for rice (measure with measuring cup or milk bottle). Add 2 level tsp. salt. Wash the rice in several rinses of cold water. When water boils furiously, add the washed rice a little at a time. Keep stirring to prevent rice from sticking together. Boil vigorously for about 25 minutes or until rice is tender, but not mushy. Drain well and place the pot high over the fire for about 10 minutes to dry the rice thoroughly. Do not place too close to the fire or it will burn. Can use Minute Rice.


In the meantime peel onions and slice thin. Break the celery apart, wash each piece, and chop into small pieces. Slice the cabbage thin. Cut the beef into small strips.

Put 1 tbsp. shortening in one frying pan. When it is hot, put in beef chunks and brown them a little. Now add 1/2 tsp. salt, 1 cup water, and 4 tsp. soy sauce. Divide the beef evenly into two pans and add half of the onions, celery and cabbage to each pan.

Simmer over a low fire until meat is tender (about 3/4 hr). If sauce begins to cook away, add a little more water and stir. When done, serve over boiled rice.
