### Smoke Signals From the Chief



WHAT IS THE PATROL METHOD?

The Patrol Method is an organization set up by Lord Baden Powel to efficiently organize a group of people. In this type of organization, we have a lead-leader, with sub-leaders. It sort of works like a tree, breaking up from the trunk. We use this same organization with the O.A. We have the Lodge, representing the trunk, and the primary branches; and the Chapters, representing the seconday and smaller branches. The trunk only provides support and a unity so the leaves can work on the common task of making shade.

Without both, the primary and the secondary parts of the tree, we wouln't have shade. So it is essential that both parts work together. We must take the responsibility upon ourselves to 'keep the tree together'. Most of us in leadership positions have been elected to serve our fellow Brothers, and if we fail, it's like chopping a limb from off the tree. It's even more damaging if it'S a primary branch that is cut.

This effect on the tree can weaken it--even kill it. It's the same with the Patrol Method and with our Lodge.

I hope everyone in a leadership position realizes the obligation he has to the organization that elected him. It's important to develop responsibility at our age because some, if not all of us, will be the leaders of tomorrow.



#### BROTHERHOOD MEMBERSHIP

Your completion of the Ordeal set you on the next part of your "long, and toilsome journey". Now, during your service as an Ordeal member, you have had ample opportunity to increase your knowledge of the Arrow and make it work for you. You have had at least 10 months of active preparation.


The time has come for you to follow your Brothers who have gone before you, and seal your membership in the Order of the Arrow. You must complete these four steps:

- Memorize the Obligation, the Order of the Arrow official song, and adminition.
  - 2. Registered active membership in the Order of the Arrow.
  - Registered active membership in Scouting.
  - 4. Ten months service as an Ordeal Member.

If you have completed your Ordeal in the year 1984, now is the time to begin thinking about sealing your membership in the Order of the Arrow by joining in the upcoming Brotherhood Ceremonies.

It is most urgent that you <u>NOW</u> write your letter to the Lodge secretary informing him of your desire to become a Brotherhood member.





It is important that you not only qualify for the above requirements, but that you feel you are prepared for the Brotherhood. YOur letter must contain (1) an explanation of what you think the Obligation means, and (2) descibe how you have been fullfilling this Obligation in your troop or post and in your daily life, and how you have used your understanding of the traditions of the Ordeal to aid in your service. (3) Describe the specific plans you have for rendering service to the Lodge in fullfillment of the new pledge you expect to take.

With this letter, you should include your advanced registration (\$6.00) and date of the Brotherhood Ceremony in which you will be participating.
