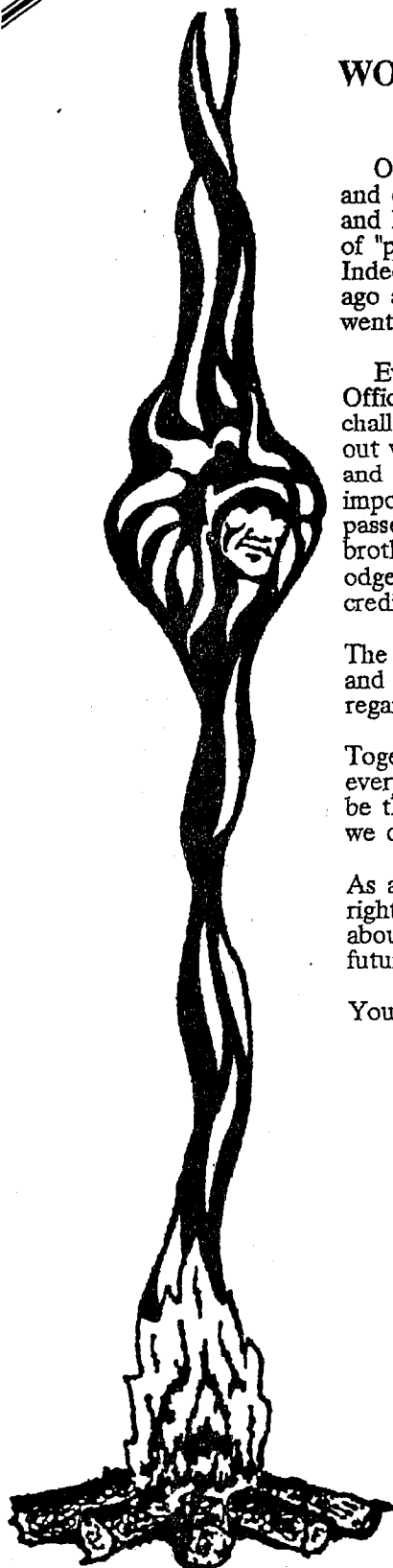

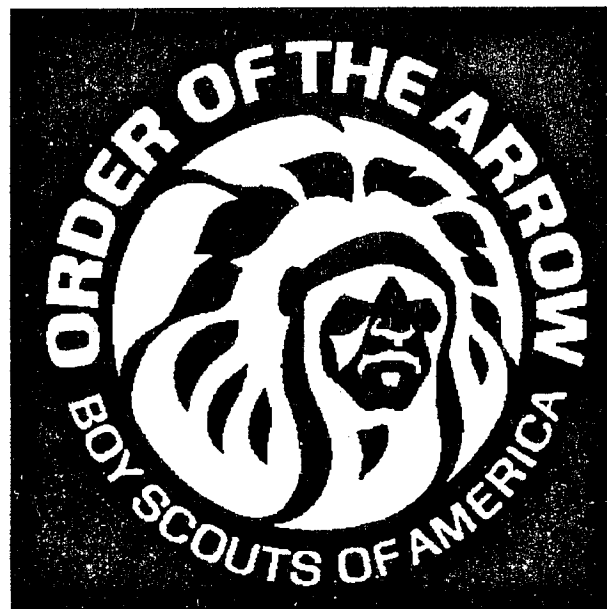

Register early. You will have the greatest time of your life. We have all of the best events from last year and some new ones too. This years activities will make this Summer

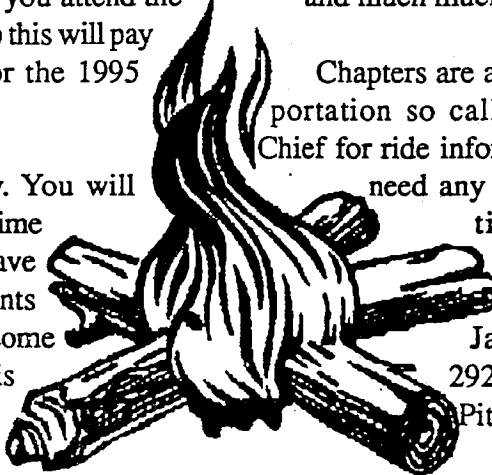

Such is the way.


In the next few weeks, take a minute and let those officers who have served us well this year know of your appreciation. While none of them would ask for it, they would appreciate it.
