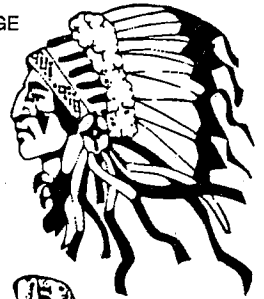

Camping AT Scout Meadow

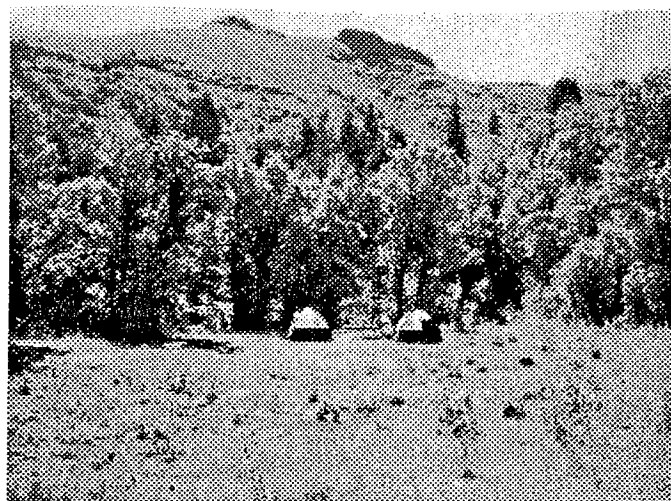

Promotion of camping in the council is a prime purpose of the Order of the Arrow. Each issue, a new camping site will be presented which has been recommended by a lodge member. We will need your help on this, so if you know of a good campsite, (with pictures, if possible) send it in to The Legend c/o the council with your name and home phone number

Many Scouters think that you have to travel some distance to find good camping areas. This month's pick is proof that you don't.

In the far southwest corner of the valley is Butterfield Canyon. Scout Meadow is up this canyon. Drive 3.5 miles up from the mouth of the canyon to the mouth of Stockings Fork (marked on USGS topo maps). A dirt road crosses the creek at this point, and a small stream empties out of Stockings Fork just to the left of the road. Hike up the dirt road until it crosses the small stream. Then follow the trail up the left (east) side of the stream. This is a beautiful trail with towering trees throughout the canyon. The trail is about one half mile long. About half way up the trail, it crosses the stream and then angles up the west hillside.

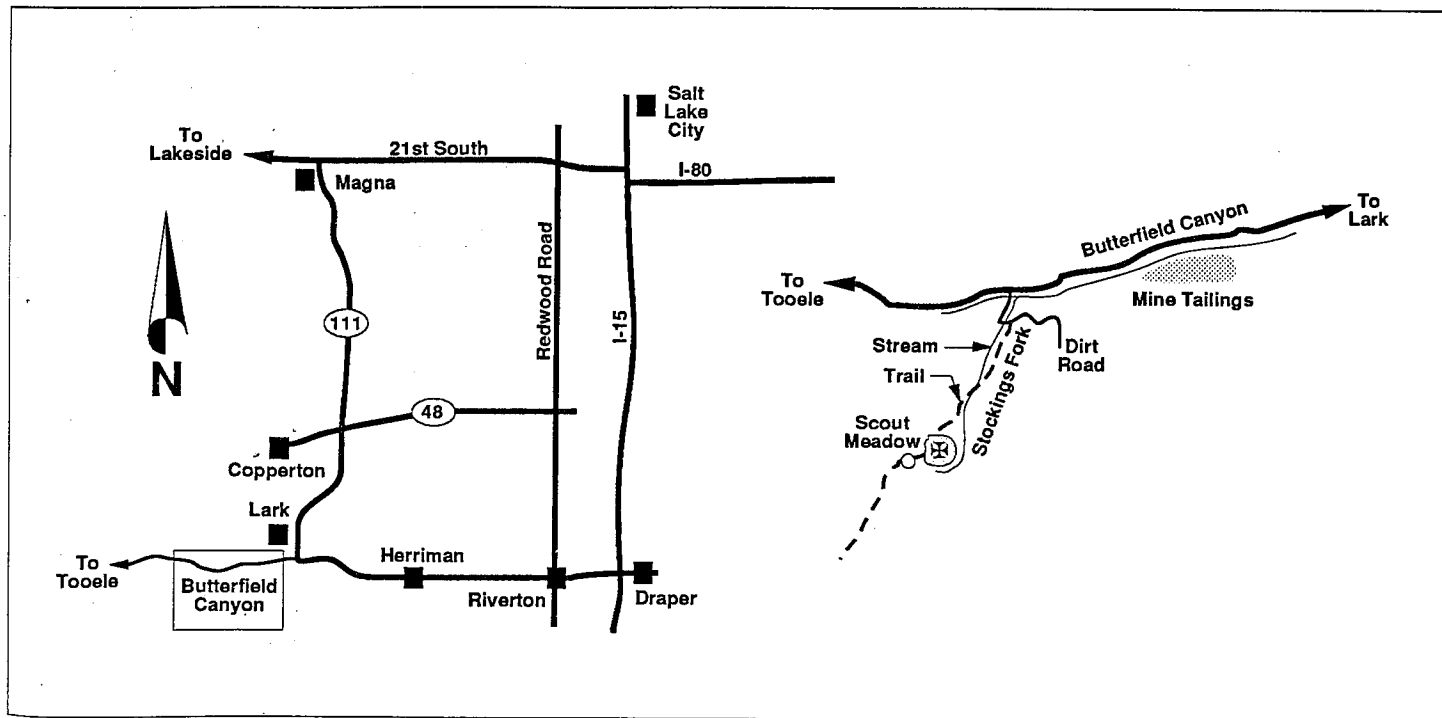
You will know you have arrived when you break out over a little rise and start down into the meadow. The meadow is large enough to hold more than one small troop if properly layed out. There are also additional camping sites further up the draw. The trail continues up the draw from the southwest



corner of the meadow. Bearing to the southwest, it passes through a small meadow and into the trees. You shortly find yourself in a grove of quaking aspen with several camping possibilities.

Water from the spring (at the southeast corner of the meadow may be safe, but boiling is advised. Giardia may be present. Fire regulations change with the season, so check before going up. If open fires are used, take advantage of established fire rings and use precaution. Firewood is abundant.

Activities include day hikes, wide games, stalking, tracking, pioneering, etc. Wildlife and birds are numerous. Often, deer and elk will visit the spring just before dark. This area has many visitors. Be courteous, and leave it BETTER than you find it.



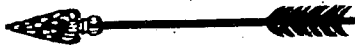
