


The October Ordeal was held on the 11th & 12th at Tracy Training Center. We had 101 candidates who completed the ordeal and become members of the lodge.



All persons under the age of 21 who meet the membership requirement, as set forth in current Order of the Arrow publications, shall be eligible for election and all persons under the age of 21 registered in any troop/varsity team capacity shall have voting priviledges in the unit election.

Cúb Scout camping experience is not to be credited toward fulfillment of the camping requirement qualification of candidates for membership election.

Elections are not to be held in explorer posts.

### ANNUAL BANQUET



### ADVISER'S MINUTE


