OUR COUNTRY'S BICENTENNIAL



After the Revolutionary War, the young Republic faced great problems. Many leaders became convinced that the Articles of Confederation of 1781 could not work because the nation was little more than an assembly of thirteen jealous and sovereign states

In 1783, Washington and Hamilton began working toward creating an entirely new form of national government. Their efforts resulted in Congress calling a convention to meet in Philadelphia, May 14, 1787.

The task of creating a new constitutional government was not easy. It was a process of argument, conflict, and compromise. Franklin inspired the members by his presence. James Madison negotiated and gained compromises. Gouverneur Morris

actually wrote the Constitution that the delegates signed on September 17, 1787.

By early January, 1789, the necessary nine states had ratified the Constitution and the first Congress under the new government met in New York City March 4th.


> Roses are red. Violets are blue. East Chapter is great And we need you.
