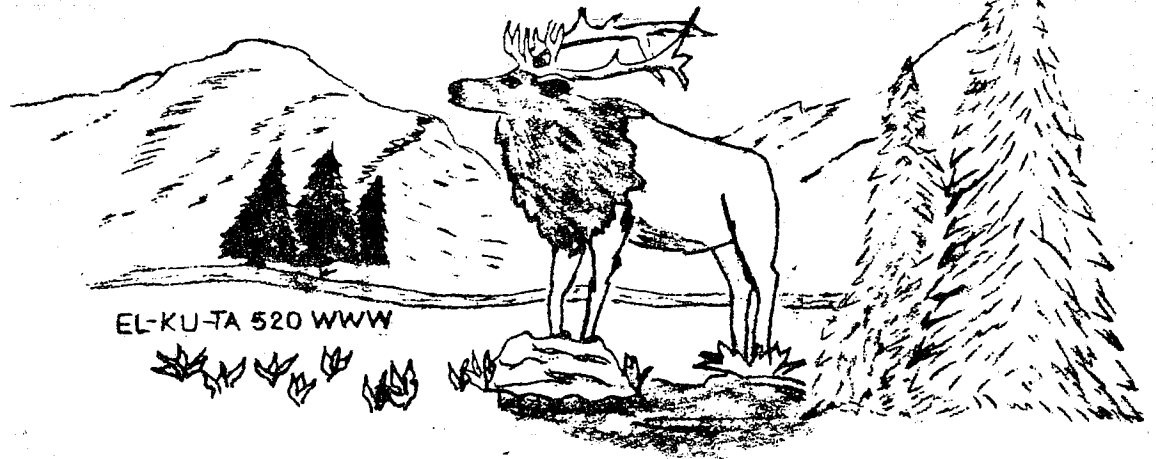

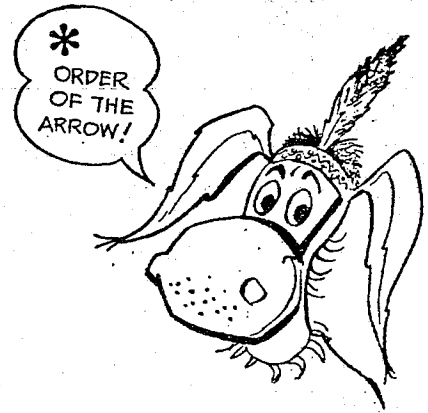


MEET THE VICE CHIEFS

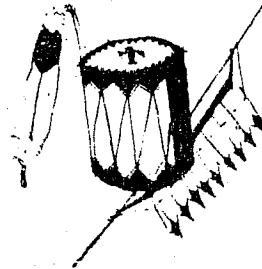

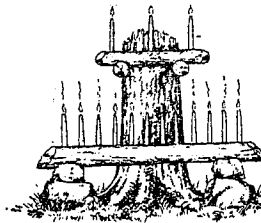

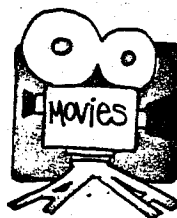
