




DAREN SAGERS, VIGIL CHIEF AFTER A LONG NIGHT

The recent ordeal inducted a new record into the Order of the Arrow and our Lodge. 174 new members joined on September 14th.

Wamblee started the record by holding tis own ordeal at Adventure Park in Utah County where service was performed for the Training School--25 new members accepted the obligation to be come arrowmen.

At Tracy (after the traffic jam) 149 candidates were in attendance. The Lodge Chief and several Vice Chiefs reported that the event was saved by the number of arrowmen to came at the last minute to help out.

40 of the candidates were bussed to Bear Lake to work on the New Bear Lake Camp, returning about 5:30 pm for the closing ceremony. The rest stayed at Tracy where numerous work projects kept "cheerful service" in action until 6:00 pm.

New members were inducted at three ceremonies and capped the event with the traditional banquet.

Steve Sudden, Lodge Secretary, reported that registrations were very heavy several days prior to the event and it looks like the same numbers will be registering for the Ordeal in October.

At 9:30 pm the last of the arrowmen and former candidates were leaving Tracy having completed a successful event.




