BILL HURST



Echow, for the past year.




DAVE DICKMAN




Camp Evergreen Camp Tomahawk Gast Fork Scoul Reservation



We had a great Ordeal last month where 168 new brothers were inducted. Ten chpaters participated in what turned to be a very productive weekend; Copperhills, Lakeshore, Mt. Olympus, Mtn. View, Oakhills, Pinedale, Riverview, Stansbury, Ute, and Wasatch. Aiding the candidates through there Ordeal were 52 members whose support was greatly appreciated. The planning committee did a fantastic job of preparing for the event and nothing was lacking as candidates faithfully completed the four tests of the Ordeal.

A large amount was put in by candidates and members alike in improvement of the camping facilities of Camp Evergreen and Camp Tomahawk. Some of the work accomplished were (1) the storage of canoes and rowboats for winter, (2) the improvement and building of trails and roadways in and around camp, (3) the burial of water and power lines, (4) the repair and improvement of campfire bowls, (5) the construction of latrines, (6) the transportation of a spring box to the spring site, (7) the improvement and clean-up of program areas, (8) the breakdown of the camps for the close of the camping season. The amount of work done proved invaluable to the camps and the service was well appreciated by camp and council officials. The lodge surely lived up to its reputation as a brotherhood of cheerful service.


