

A lost in the Michigan woods—taught me a lesson I've never forgotten. Badly frightened, approaching panic, I wandered around in circles for hours. Finally, the moon came out and I was able to get my bearings. I had been hopelessly lost in a wooded area only a mile square! This experience taught me never to go into unfamiliar territory without a com-

pass and to keep cool no matter what happens.
Since then I've always carried the twoounce package of life insurance I call my
"Lost Kit." Even in the jungles of the Pacific,
it was mighty useful. Carrying this kit gives me confidence, for I know I won't lose my bearings—or my head—as I did that night up in Michigan. The big advantage of the kit is that it's light and small enough to carry with you always. Pack it in a metal or plastic box; then seal it against moisture with adhesive tape.

This kit will help you get by in an emergency, but only thorough training will guarantee your survival under really tough conditions. The essentials of survival are food, fire, shelter, and travel-and the most important of these is firemaking.

This page outlines the training you need to master these essentials. Study it carefully, Master the skills. Some day they may save your life!


