BROTHERHOOD






Requirements met prior to August 31, 1988 will not be counted for the Award.

TREASURE ISLAND MADE AN HISTORIC SITE!!!!!!

The State of Pennsylvania recognized the site of the organization of the Order of the Arrow by placing a marker commemorating the Treasure Island camp as the birthplace of the Order of the Arrow. A 45" X 45" cast iron and aluminum marker has been placed and reads: "Treasure Island Reservation:

Consisting of Treasure Island and Marshall Island. Home to one of the nation's oldest Boy Scout camps, established by the Philadelphia Council, B.S.A. in 1913. Birthplace of the Order of the Arrow, a national campers' honor society founded upon native American traditions. Its Unami Lodge No. 1 was created here in 1915 by the camp's first director, E. Urner Goodman, and his assistant Carroll A. Edson. PENNSYLVANIA HISTORICAL AND MUSEUM COMMISSION 1989."
