The last job I have as lodge secretary is to give you the new lodge officers for the coming year:


#### LODGE CHIEF


#### LODGE VICE CHIEFS





#### BIG EVENT





# **National Operations Updates**

Adult Leader Elections . . .

Adult Leaders in Units. If a troop, team, or post holds an election for youth candidates, the unit committee may recommend one adult to the lodge adult selection committee. The lodge adult selection committee is composed of the lodge advise, the lodge staff adviser, and the the chairman of the council committee on which the lodge adviser serves. Recommendation of the lodge adult selection committee with the approval of the Scout Executive may be candidates for induction providing all of the following conditions are fulfilled:

Selection is based upon ability to perform the necessary functions and not for recognition of service, including current or prior achievement and position.

The individual will be an asset to the Order due to demonstrated skills and abilities which fulfill the purpose of the Order. The camping requirements set forth for youth members must be fulfilled. The adult leader's membership will provide a positive role model for the growth and development of the youth members of the lodge.

Adult Leaders In Council and District Positions. The lodge adviser, district chairman, council president or members of the professional staff any propose adults to the lodge adult selection committee. Upon approval and with the approval of the Scout Executive, they will be candidates for induction. For these scouters, the camping requirement may be waived by the lodge adviser and Scout executive.

Adults may be proposed only one time per year as either unit scouters or district/council scouters. How they are proposed depends on their primary registration. National Operations Update 91-1

Advisor's note: This procedure is now being followed in the lodge with respect to adult recommendations. Please note that approval of the Lodge Executive Committee of Lodge Officers is no longer a part of the procedure.

#### RE-REGISTRATION:

If your label show an expiration date of 1991, mail it in with \$5.00 and up date your registration for the coming year. Brotherhood and Vigil can not be considered unless your registration is active.

#### Visitors at Ceremonles . . .

Ceremonies used in the Order of the Arrow are private for members only. However, any responsible adult concerned about the content of the ceremonies may be invited to observe with an adult member of the Order as their host and guide.

If possible, the lodge adviser and host should discuss elements of the ceremony or any other concerns prior to extending an invitation to observe.

If the adult is still concerned about the contents of the ceremony and requests permission to see the ceremony after discussion, permission should be granted with the understanding that the visitor must not interfere with the ceremony. Non-Arrowmen are not otherwise permitted to view any ceremonies. National Operations Update 91-2


